Speaking of prayer, we have been praying faithfully for our building and the repairs that are needed. We have a Long-Range Planning Committee who is helping to do some of the hard work of finding out what our options are, but now we have established a Remodeling Committee to help evaluate where and what needs to be repaired first and in what order. While we are still in the legal battle, we need to begin the hard work of fixing our building while we are in it. So do not cease praying, especially for the wisdom to know what to do with what God presents to us. Be prepared to be challenged as we step out in faith!

Let us not lose focus on the reason for the *ecclesia* (the assembly), which is the Greek word for church in the New Testament. We are gathered believers who celebrate the Gospel by growing in it, sharing it, and living it out. May His truth rule in our hearts and minds.

Back to Church Sunday

Over the course of only 24 hours, the church office at Westmont was able to minister to and assist two precious ladies who needed the listening ear of someone who genuinely cared. To protect their anonymity, we will call them 'Sarah' and 'Tiffany.'

Sarah's husband was diagnosed with terminal cancer and is no longer able to work. She is raising two of her grandchildren, and she provides daycare for her great-grandchild during the work-week. For the first time in their marriage, they are behind on their rent for the month of August. This hard-working and talented lady wept in our office sitting area as she told us the story of how broken she is knowing that her husband of many years is slipping away. Moreover, she conveyed that he is not only nearing death, but he is doing so without the Lord. Sarah witnesses to him every day, and tries diligently to help him understand that without Christ, there is no hope. This breaks her heart.

We prayed with Sarah, prayed for the salvation of her husband, and we gave her a modest donation to assist with her rent. We assured her that this is a place where she can come at any time to pray with us, be encouraged, and be strengthened through the ministry of the staff of Westmont. She was truly grateful, and we look forward to praying with her again very soon.

Tiffany wept uncontrollably as a staff member embraced her and gave her water and tissues. Within a few minutes, this dear lady was gently led away from the emotional depths of despair that she carried when she entered the building. Tiffany had come to the church after sleeping in the park all night. She has been on the street since her house completely burned down in west Lubbock.

Unable to provide a roof over the heads of her three children, Tiffany sorrowfully called CPS to ask for assistance to house her children. They have provided places for them. Tiffany wished that her family could have helped during this desperate time, but most are addicted to drugs.

As she talked, we were encouraged to hear that she was employed at a local gas station. This is a great blessing for Tiffany. Her employer is working with her during this arduous time.

Tiffany asked for nothing as she sat and shared with us. She needed hope. She needed prayer. She needed human hands holding hers so that she could feel the love of another human being. That's simply all she wanted. She told us that several churches in the area refused to listen to her story and comfort her. Westmont did! Westmont was here to fill the immediate need that she desperately needed in that moment...the love of Christ through one of His children at Westmont.

Tiffany has been approved for HUD housing and is awaiting the location of her new home. At that time, she is hopeful that she will be able to bring her children back home so they will be a united family once again. Though she asked for nothing, we are going to reconnect with Tiffany, and we will provide modest assistance for the deposit that she must provide.

As she left, she was a changed lady because of the power of Christ that she experienced inside the doorway of Westmont. That is beautiful. That is so <u>very</u> special, and we are grateful.

Know that God used this church in these two examples, and He does so in <u>so many more ways</u> each and every week. **The Lighthouse of Christ is burning brightly at 4808 Utica.** Praise God for His Son, the Light of the world, who powers the outreach ministry of this church! Amen.



Chosen Sunday School Class

Chosen Sunday School Class and Westmont Family,

We are beginning a new Bible study in the *Chosen Class* beginning September 3rd. It will be a 9 to 10 week study. We will continue the Chosen study, Season 4 in Jan/Feb. 2024 (We do not know the release date at this time.) We can hardly wait!

The study we will begin now is called "God's Big Picture: Tracing the Storyline of the Bible" by Vaughan Roberts. It "traces the story of the whole Bible from Genesis to Revelation to see how it all fits together, telling of God's wonderful plan to save the world through Jesus Christ." This will be very timely, as we have been studying the life and ministry of Christ. This study will help us to see how it all fits into God's unfolding story since the beginning of creation.

Each Sunday morning we will watch a video in class (approximately 10 - 12 minutes), as we are provided a talk outline for notes during the video. Then, we will have active group discussion along with a Bible study guide that reveals key scriptures and asks further questions. There is a study book you may purchase. The paperback is \$16.00, but it is not required.

Pastor Jarid encourages everyone to come to this study for a foundational look at what God has in store, through the person and work of Christ, for His creation. If you desire to come to this study, we will welcome you in the Fellowship Hall on the east side at the round tables Sunday mornings at 9:30 a.m.
